

NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF INSTITUTIONAL AND FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION

In the Higher Education Act, as amended, Congress requires that colleges annually distribute to all enrolled students a notice of the availability of institutional and financial aid information. This notice must list and briefly describe the required information and include a statement of the procedures required to obtain the information. That list is shown below. This list is not a comprehensive list of *all* HEA disclosures, but only those for which an annual notice must be issued.

Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

FERPA was designed to protect the privacy of an enrolled student's education records. The College's FERPA policy contains information pertaining to:

- An enrolled student's right to, and procedures for, inspecting, reviewing and requesting amendment of his educational records;
- An enrolled student's right to consent to disclosure of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education, and to obtain a copy of the student records policy;
- Information about the College's policy regarding disclosures to school officials with a legitimate educational interest in the education records;
- A description of who, besides the student, has legitimate access to student education records without the student's consent; and
- A list of what is included in Directory Information.

Available Financial Assistance

 - Terms and conditions of Title IV, HEA loans
 - Criteria for selecting recipients and determining amount of award
 - o Eligibility requirements and procedures for applying for aid
 - Method and frequency of disbursements of aid

- Rights and responsibilities of students receiving Title IV and other financial aid, including:
 - Criteria for continued eligibility and standards for satisfactory academic progress including criteria to reestablish eligibility if student fails to maintain satisfactory academic progress. The College's <u>General</u> and <u>Federal Student Aid</u> satisfactory academic progress policies are available on our website.
 - Terms of any loans received, sample loan repayment schedules and the necessity for repaying loans
 - General conditions and terms applicable to any employment offered as part of student's financial aid award
 - <u>Exit counseling information</u> required to be provided and to be collected from student borrowers of the Direct Loan Program.
